
BOOK OF CONDOLENCES

REV DR HENRY CLIVE 'DOC' KROHN Principal of Cromwell College 1975 – 1995

Passed away on the 26th July 2020 aged 91. Husband of Judy, Father and Father in Law of Jenny and Trevor, John and Trudy. Granddad to Rachel and Joe, and Jeffrey.





"I was privileged to meet Rev Dr Clive Krohn at a Formal Dinner early in my Principalship of Cromwell. It was humbling to meet a such fine and humble gentleman who had served as Principal here for two decades. 1975-1995 was a time of significant societal change, yet Clive was able to navigate the college successfully with the resources that he had, whilst maintaining the enormous love and respect that the student body had for him. Many past students from that era visiting Cromwell in the past decade have spoken to me telling how pastoral, caring, sincere and loved "Doc Krohn" was. He certainly had a very positive impact on a generation of young people who passed through Cromwell during his lengthy Principalship.

Clive didn't need a monument named in his honour to generate the spontaneous affection and high esteem that so many people hold him in over such a long period of time. If Cromwell is first and foremost about the students, creating family, genuine servant leadership and loving pastoral care, then Clive delivered brilliantly. His students two and a half decades since his departure attest to that.

Perhaps Clive's greatest achievement at Cromwell is that he is remembered so fondly by so many people over such a long period of time. Jenny and I and the whole Cromwell College community extend our thoughts and prayers to Judy and the Krohn family with the passing of Clive."
